Carrollton Ranked #1 in Economic Development

Carrollton Economic Development Ranks Number One in DBJ List

Due to major projects such as the location of CyrusOne Data Center and Earl Owen's headquarters and distribution center, the City of Carrollton Economic Development Department has been ranked as the number one Largest North Texas Economic Development agencies, according to the Dallas Business Journal (DBJ).

The DBJ released their annual list last week, ranked by value of deals completed in 2012. Carrollton rose from a ranking of number nine in 2011 to the coveted number one spot, with a value of deals done rising from \$123 million in 2011 to \$356.7 million in 2012. Number of deals done in 2012 was 112, up from 45 in 2011.

"This is a prime example of the ways in which we are working to diversify our tax base, bring in new sales tax and construction revenue, and leverage development opportunities. Carrollton's excellent location, safety, and neighborhoods make it the best place for business in North Texas," said Mayor Mathew Marchant.

Fort Worth, Richardson and Dallas finished in the second, third and fourth positions. Also finishing in the top 25 was immediate and area neighbors, including the City of Farmers Branch (6), Town of Addison (7), Dallas Regional Chamber (8), Plano Economic Development (9), Allen Economic Development (13) and McKinney Economic Development (14) among others.

Carrollton Named One of the 50 Safest Cities in Texas

SafeWise, which provides research and reviews on home security systems and community safety initiatives, has included the City of Carrollton on its list of the Top 50 safest cities in Texas for 2013.

The group looked at all cities in Texas with more than 20,000 residents and paired it with data from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's 2011 Crime in the U.S. report as well as its own research that looked at unique safety initiatives and security programs implemented by cities and municipalities.

"Public safety is the most important service provided to the citizens by the City, and we will continue to innovate and improve to keep our citizens safe," said City of Carrollton Mayor Matthew Marchant.

"Our focus is to make Carrollton a safe place to live, work, and visit. The men and women who serve this community do so with pride because we can see the results of our efforts," commented City of Carrollton Police Chief Rex Redden.

Safewise write-up for Carrollton: "Diverse, cultured, and booming are just three words that describe Carrollton, Texas. Located in the hub of the Dallas-Fort Worth area, Carrollton is not only an energetic residential community, it's a flourishing business community as well. In fact, over 5,000 businesses call Carrollton home. Newcomers will be welcomed into a community that's well educated."

The report continues, "Over 34 percent of Carrollton residents have attained a bachelor's degree or higher, and those who want to continue their education will be glad to know that the city is conveniently located within 30 minutes of most colleges and universities in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. With more than 1200 acres of parkland, more than 50 lakes and 100 public and private golf courses within a 100-mile radius, Carrollton is a recreation mecca. All this, plus the fact that the FBI's Crime Report notes Carrollton's relatively low crime rate very likely contributed to it being named by Forbes magazine as number 12 on its list of America's Best Places to Move."

Looking at the past 6 months of sales data for neighborhoods:

- Oak Creek Estates sold 12 properties Avg Sales Price: \$310K (\$106/ sf) Avg days on mkt: 22—Avg SQ FT 2,918
- Highlands Carrollton sold 6 properties –Avg Sales Price: \$261K (\$104/sf) Avg days on mkt: 9—Avg SQ FT- 2,494
- Creekside Estates sold 4 properties Avg Sales Price: \$475K (\$111/ sf) Avg days on mkt: 52—Avg SQ FT 4,237

Although inventory and Days on Market are higher since the last newsletter, this is not uncommon during this time of year. Prices in much of the metroplex remain strong and sales are better than last year. According to NTREIS (the North Texas MLS) Median Sales Prices in October increased 13.1% to \$173,000 for the North Texas Market Area. While new listings continue to increase, overall inventory levels continue to shrink as average Days on Market decreases and absorption rates improve compared to Q4 last year. This blog posting, from Keeping Current Matters may better explain what much of the country, as a whole, is currently experiencing.

Will Rates be Heading up in 2014?

According to chief economist at Freddie Mac, Frank Nothaft, 2014 will be a year of stepped up regulations in the mortgage sector, he also sees mortgage rates getting close to 5% as the Fed begins to scale back on its current QE program. Mr. Nothaft sees an announcement of scaling back in the first half of the year and says that when such a big buyer begins to taper its purchases, home loan rates will begin to rise.

Timely Tips for December Gardeners from Calloway's and Cornelius Nursery

Winter can be a wonderful time of year in the garden.



Winter can be a wonderful time of year in the garden. Winter may lack the wild riot of color and growth that we all so love in Spring, but Winter has a different kind of beauty. Some of our favorite Winter gardens are understated, tranquil and calming. Interesting evergreen shrubs and grasses really stand out in this season, as well as trees with beautiful bark. Flowering shrubs like Camellias are Winter favorites.



As for annuals, we Texans are quite fortunate in Winter choices. The new generation of cool season pansies will provide color from now until late Spring. Other flowering annuals like Snapdragons, Cyclamen, Flowering Cabbage and Kale provide both color and shape for the Winter garden.

Even better Winter is the perfect time to plan and lay the foundation for Spring. December is the month to plant your chilled bulbs for big Spring blooms. And this is also a good time to prune and reshape your trees and shrubs. Do not top crapemyrtles, simply remove the seedheads and prune for shape.

You should also prepare your garden for cold weather. First of all, make sure that your plants are in excellent shape, well-watered and well-fed, because a healthy plant will survive cold snaps more easily. 3 to 4 inches of mulch provides insulation that keeps the ground beneath it warmer, thus protecting roots. If you have tender plants, stock up on Frost Cloth now, so that you have it on hand when you need it. Frost Cloth is simply an insulating blanket for your plants. It should be draped over them when cold weather is approaching. To be effective the Frost Cloth should reach the ground all the way around, so that it effectively captures the heat emanating from the ground and keeps the air around your plants marginally warmer.

It's a lovely season in Texas, enjoy the cool bite of frosty mornings, warm drinks by the fireside, bright lights on trees and homes, and most of all, your treasured family and friends.
